

As a Japonologist teaching also a seminar on Japanese society I am usually sceptical about popular books "on Japan" in general, since they usually portray Japan one-sidedly, their main feature being exoticism (Japan as "different" from us) and a collection of stereotypes beginning with geishas and kimonos and ending in sakura blossoms and Zen-buddhism. The Little Book of Japan by Anderson and Vilhar doesn't shy away from these stereotypes presenting a full collection from bonsai and onsen to sushi and Japanese festivals. However, the way it does present them and the effects it achieves by it made me like this book immensely. First of all it is an extremely beautiful book. Not just the stunning photographs page after page, but its design, layout and form as well must make every book-fetishist love this little square hard-cover beauty (in the case of this book, Kindle version probably cannot come close to the experience of holding it in your hand). But more than that, the book brings all the afore-mentioned classical "topoi" of Japan through an extremely well-organised structure of four chapters, from "Cultural Icons", "Traditions", "Places" to "Spiritual Life", each of them featuring from 10 to 12 subchapters on specific topics. These topics are all introduced with short but extremely concise explanations where a large majority of each page is always reserved for stunningly beautiful photographs. Short but very informative explanations are extremely useful for anyone with an interest in Japan who wants to get the general idea about almost fifty different topics relevant to Japanese culture. This is a big plus for the book because even though the interest in Japan is widespread among the general public, there are many confused ideas and misconceptions floating around about this country.
