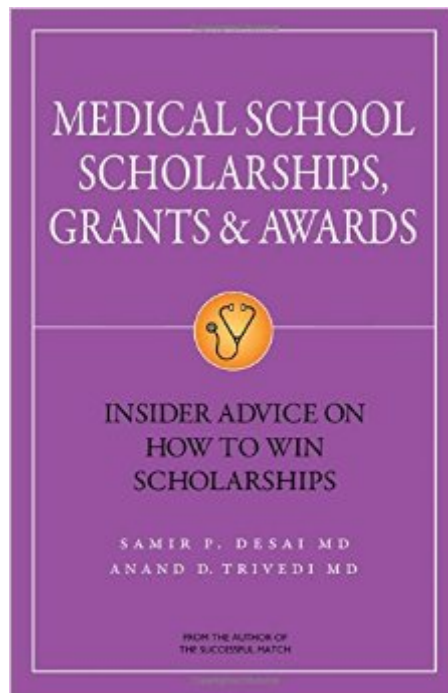

- Raise your stature in your medical school. Make you more attractive for other awards and scholarships.
- Further your professional reputation and enhance your credibility in the areas that form the basis for the award.
- Solidify the support of faculty who become reference letter writers. Strengthening these relationships over time allows faculty members to write strong letters of recommendation for residency.

The first 60 pages of this book are pure gold. It's filled with information about the application process, blunders to avoid, and nominating yourself to represent your school. He describes many specialized, proactive techniques to gather scholarship information, including advice that seems like common sense only after you read it. For example:- It's less competitive to apply for smaller monetary awards than larger ones.- Spelling really matters! Not proofreading can really kill your chances.- The importance of a refined CV as an art of self promotion (with a table of positive action verbs). It's nice to have the myths and tips addressed one at a time, with citations and statistics to back them. Additionally, they also provide sample inquiry letters to take out the uneasiness of sounding unprofessional. The rest of the book, about 500 pages, consists of an excellent breakdown of scholarships with their descriptions. It's organized by state, community, leaderships, and research interests. The punch line is that regardless of who you are and what you do with your limited free

time, there are scholarships out there that fit you. Many scholarships are based purely on writing an essay or sharing a personal experience. Some are from smaller organizations or companies unknown to me. This book makes a complex process very simple. As a medical student and a sometimes-successful scholarship applicant, I was looking for a book with information on how to become more competitive. I'm really glad that I took the time to pick this one up! I've only read it once, but can see myself using it as a reference again at each step. Wish me luck as I try to earn more \$\$! I also think the beginning of this book will be extremely useful as I apply for away rotations. It speaks on the art of self-promotion and standing out from the crowd.

For those of you who are applying to medical school, or are in medical school, you may not think that scholarships, grants and awards are important compared to your grades and USMLE board scores, but when you apply to residency, there is a part on Electronic Residency Application Service (ERAS) that asks you about these things, and if you don't have anything to fill this part out with, your application will look empty compared to the other applicant's. Those grades and board scores will mainly show them that you can pass an exam, and won't show your interest in their specialty as much as a scholarship or award, which like the book emphasizes, will also help you get that awesome Letter of Recommendation (LoR). I used to screen applicants who were applying to my Transitional Year and was quite impressed with the LoRs that mentioned anything about a scholarship or award. So even one or two scholarships, grants or awards will make you stand out from the rest of the applicants. And if you want to keep the option of doing a subspecialty open, they will again ask you if you have ever had any scholarships or awards. Financially, you may not think about it much at first and think, "Oh, I'll make enough money to pay back all those loans one day.", but when you're in residency and you have that loan hanging over your head, it's an unnecessary stress to have. It's not easy to brush off \$200-300 thousand dollars worth of loans. Plus, interest accrues because you can only forbear it, not defer it, and interest definitely accrues on that amount of money. Even if your parents pay for your medical school education, help them out, and at the same time, make yourself look like a rock star. I highly recommend this book as part of your arsenal to become a rock star physician. You will be the envy of your classmates and colleagues.

I'm an M3 hoping to get into orthopedic surgery, and the advice in this book related to both my specialty and my state were indispensable. I saved a ton of money (close to \$3000) and my CV looks a lot better for it. I'd consider it a must buy.

I picked this up after checking out Dr. Desai's other books in my school's library and their website medschoolawards.com. I was initially skeptical of the book, as I thought many of the awards would not apply to me. I was delighted to find a few awards I will be able to apply to so far. Plus, the organization of the book is a definite plus. Would recommend this book if you are looking to add something to your resume for residency or simply help mitigate some of your debt. Great resource.
