

Neal Bascomb's "The Winter Fortress" is history that reads like a novel, and despite scrupulous research, as is obvious from the end notes, it does just that. He presents us with the saboteurs approaching the heavy water plant at Vemork, Norway, and then skips backward in time to present us with the events leading up to the mission. He describes heavy water to us, and its uses and importance (only vaguely understood before the war), before introducing the players - both allied and German - against the backdrop of Hitler's invasion of Norway. We learn who they are and how

they came to be trudging through the snow in February 1943. The process of producing heavy water is fascinating in itself. The efforts by allies and Germans to engage in atomic research has been fully elucidated elsewhere, but its inclusion here is necessary to the story, and Bascomb does not dwell on it at the expense of that story. Mostly, he is interested in the characters who populate his account, from Norwegian soldiers and scientists to German scientists and soldiers (and Gestapo) to British soldiers (and Churchill). We learn quite a bit about them, and as in a well-written novel, begin to feel we understand something of their motivations. What they went through is truly astonishing. From tales of Gestapo brutality to forces of nature almost as horrific, the men who risked and gave their lives to derail Nazi Germany's atomic research have proven themselves to be heroes. You may have read about these efforts before, but probably not at such depth. I had no idea some of the Norwegians engaged in the effort were literally starving to death leading up to it. Hitler's infamous Kommandobefehl (Commando Order) was, in many ways, the least of their problems.
